## **SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS**

### **1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND**

The National Lotteries Commission (The NL C) is a public entity established by Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the NLC can be divided into two categories, namely “regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries” and “administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)”.

The Distributing Agencies (DA's) who are appointed by the Minister of Trade & Industry are responsible for the adjudication of the funding applications as per the Lotteries Act and applicable Regulations.

The NLC requires a suitably qualified electrical service provider for the supply, delivery, installation, commissioning and three (3) years maintenance contract of a 20 KVA Solar system with battery capacity for 8 hours for the NLC Kimberly Office.

### **2. PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENT**

#### **2.1. The following are the activities required for the service provider:-**

- o To Supply, deliver, rigging, installation, testing, commissioning. This will include for construction stand, openings, rebates., required by the bidder for the installation of the equipment:
- o The supply, delivery, installation, and commissioning of 20kVA Solar system,
- o The Solar system must connect to the main Distribution Board to kick-in immediately when the power is off to avoid any interruptions.
- o The cabling and connection to the Distribution Board supplying 400 square meters of building space (The correct measurements to be confirmed during the compulsory site inspection)
- o The testing of the Solar system upon completion of the installation
- o The quarterly maintenance contract of the Solar system for the period of thirty-six (36) months.
- o The bidder to issue CoC certificate upon completion.
- o Supply battery backup for 8hours.
- o Online monitoring system with reports capabilities i.e. live solar power generation, storage capacity, daily consumption
- o The following tests are to be carried out:

- After completion of the work, and before signing off the job card by NLC full test will be carried out on the installation to determine the satisfactory working thereof. During this period the installation will be inspected, and the bidder shall make good to the satisfaction of the NLC any defects which may arise.
  - The bidder shall provide all instruments and equipment required for testing and, power required for the commissioning and testing of the installation upon completion.
  - Test reports to be submitted to NLC.
- o Only registered and NRS097 approved inverters must be used in all installation.
  - o An electrical engineer designed and signed off drawings must be made available to the NLC upon completion of the works inclusive of the following:
    - Invertor NRS097 certificate of approval.
    - Invertor/ Battery manufacture approved compatibility document.
    - Solar Panels mounting rails compliance certificates.
    - Solar panels, invertor, and battery warranty documents.

### 3. WARRANTY AND MAINTENANCE

- Provide a written works guarantee for the period of 12 months from the date of site handover to the client.
- If during this period the equipment is not in good working order, or not working satisfactorily owing to faulty material, design or workmanship, the bidder will be notified, and immediate steps shall be taken to rectify the defects and/or replace the affected parts on site at his own expense.
- The bidder shall maintain and keep the equipment in good working condition for the full three (3) year period on expiry of the manufacturer's warranty.
- A quarterly maintenance schedule should be provided to the NLC by the winning bidder on an annual basis.
- During this period the winning bidder will undertake to arrange that the equipment be inspected at least once every month and shall:
  - Report to the Officer-in-charge keeping the maintenance records.
  - Perform minor service of the Solar system set every three months.
  - Check the battery health and replace where necessary.
  - Check the battery and top-up the electrolyte when necessary.

#### 4. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The service provider will report to the NLC Supply Chain Management & Facilities (SCM&F) Department.

#### 5. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The expected duration of the project is 30 days for installation and 3 years after the signing of a Service Level Agreement (SLA) for service and maintenance.

### SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

#### 1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the Commission.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from the Commission.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the Commission.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official Commission Purchase Order form has been received.
- 1.6 This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act of 2000 and PPRof 2022.
- 1.7 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at [www.csd.gov.za](http://www.csd.gov.za).
- 1.8 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant.
- 1.9 All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded to [bids@nlcsa.org.za](mailto:bids@nlcsa.org.za), within five (5) days of the closing date.
- 1.10 Any supplier who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a

specific brand must inform the Commission via the email.

## **2. General rules and instructions**

### 2.1 News and press releases

2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the Commission.

### 2.2 Precedence of documents

2.2.1 This RFQ consists of several sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFQ and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFQ submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFP shall take precedence.

2.2.2 Where this RFP is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the Commission may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by the Commission.

2.2.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFQ. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the Commission as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the commission in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

### 2.3 Preferential procurement reform

2.3.1 The commission supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the commission insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B- BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.

### 2.4 National Industrial Participation Programme.

2.4.1 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).

## 2.5 Language

2.5.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.

## 2.6 Gender

2.6.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

## 2.7 Headings

2.7.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.

## 2.8 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993

2.8.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFQ and/ or subsequent agreement. the commission reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to the commission.

## 2.9 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information

2.9.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA and NLC SCM Policy.

The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the commission is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the commission is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.

2.9.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the commission Data Privacy Policy.

2.9.3 The commission will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e., the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the procedures as specified in the commission PAIA manual.

2.9.4 In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

### **3. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database**

- 3.1 Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information.
- 3.2 The Commission may not award business to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD.
- 3.3 Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

### **4. Confidentiality**

- 4.1 Bids submitted for this Request for Quotation will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding.
- 4.2 The Commission reserves all the rights afforded to it by the POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in RFQ.
- 4.3 The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The Commission and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the Commission in terms of this bid award and only for the purposes as detailed in this RFQ and in accordance with any applicable law.
- 4.4 The Bidder shall notify the Commission in writing of any unauthorised access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and report such crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

### **5. Communication**

- 5.1 Specific queries relating to this RFQ should be submitted [bids@nlcsa.org.za](mailto:bids@nlcsa.org.za), before the closing date.
- 5.2 In the interest of fairness and transparency the Commission's response to such a query may be made available to other bidders.
- 5.3 It is prohibited for bidders to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of the Commission in respect of this RFQ between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 5.4 Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

### **SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA**

The Commission will evaluate all proposals in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2022 and Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act. No. 5 of 2000 (PPPFA). The six (6) phase evaluation criteria will be considered in evaluating the proposals, being:

#### **Stage 1: RFQ Closing Date and Submission Instructions and Format**

##### **RFQ Closing Details**

Bid submissions must be submitted in a PDF format that is protected from any modifications, deletions, or additions.

Financial/pricing information must be presented in a separate attachment from the Technical/Functional Response information. The onus is on the Bidder to ensure that all mandatory and required documents are included in the electronic submission.

Submissions must be prominently marked with the full details of the tender namely Bidder's Name, RFQ No and Title.

Bidders are advised to email electronic submissions at least thirty minutes before the bid closing time to cater for any possible delay in transmission or receipt of the bid. The onus is on bidder to ensure that the bid is submitted on time via email.

Tender submission emails received after submission date and time will be declared late bid submissions and will not be accepted for consideration by the Commission.

The Commission will not be responsible for any failure or delay in the email transmission or receipt of the email including but not limited to:

- Receipt of incomplete bid
- File size (must not exceed 30mb)
- Delay in transmission or receipt of the bid
- Failure of the Bidder to properly identify the bid.
- Illegibility of the bid; or
- Security of the bid data.



## Stage 2: Administrative and Mandatory Compliance

All bid respondents must submit mandatory documents that comply with all mandatory requirements. Bids that do not fully comply with the mandatory requirements will be disqualified and will not be considered for further evaluation. A maximum of 80 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

Ps = Points scored for price of bid under consideration

Pt = Price of bid under consideration

Pmax = Price of highest acceptable bid

- The points scored for the specific goal must be added to the points scored for price and the total must be rounded off to the nearest two decimal places.
- Final appointment to be awarded to the tenderer scoring the highest points.

### Stage 5: Due Diligence

The Commission reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise on the preferred bidder/s as part of a material risk evaluation aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder.

### Stage 6: Contract and Award

The stage is for negotiation after receipt of formal tenders and before the conclusion of contracts with suppliers/contractors submitting the lowest acceptable tender with a view to obtaining an improvement in price, delivery, or content, in circumstances which do not put other tenderers at a disadvantage or affect adversely their confidence or trust in the competitive system. Bidders may be requested to provide their best and final offers based on contract negotiations.
