- 2.1 News and press releases
- 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or theawarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, NLC.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
- 2.2.1 This RFQ consists of several sections (see list).
