

CHARITIES SECTOR FUNDING FOCUS AREAS 2024/25 CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Charities Distributing Agency (CDA) established in terms of the Lotteries Act, 1997 (no. 57 of 1997 as amended) is once again able to consider applications from funding from the proceeds of the National Lottery.

The Charities sector's overall goal is to contribute to sustainable development of poor communities, poverty alleviation, and protection and support for vulnerable target groups through the provision of integrated holistic services.

In adjudicating applications, the CDA will give preference to applications that respond to social and economic challenges in underdeveloped areas; that advance the interests and participation of women, youth, and people with disabilities; that lead to job creation and retention; and that align to the priorities of government as captured in the NDP and the Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Plan (ERRP). Applicants will also be expected to demonstrate that they have the requisite capacity (i.e., personnel, skills, experience, systems) to manage the programme.

PLEASE NOTE.

Applicants must register their organisations on the NLC portal before responding to the Call for Applications. Organisations that are not registered on the NLC portal will not be able to apply for funding. Please note that there is no deadline for registration. Registering your organisation does not constitute a grant application submission. Applicants are encouraged to read the published Application Guidelines to prepare for their funding submission.

Note further that applicants may only apply for grants under one sector.



ADDITIONAL FUNDING SUPPORT FOR FOOD SECURITY AND CLIMATE CHANGE CHALLENGES

NPOs applying under Programmes 1 – 3 with suitable physical infrastructure may include the following measures to be supported in their application:

• Establishment / expansion of homestead / community gardens / permaculture / micro-agriculture initiatives (excluding livestock). The activity should not be stand-alone but linked to or integrated with existing initiatives or services e.g. a food garden to provide fresh vegetables for improved nutrition of beneficiaries.

Note that the above funding stream will not stand alone but are additional elected measures to be supported as part of the application for Programmes 1 - 3.
